Twelve Dane County Libraries will partner with the Greater Madison Jazz Consortium to offer one of three different programs about jazz. They are: **Journey of Jazz** with the Hanah Jon Taylor Artet performing music representing the various periods of jazz, interspersed with presentations by Taylor about each era; **Jazz is a Heartbeat** with Poet Fabu intertwining jazz poetry with musical numbers performed by Hanah Jon Taylor, bracketed by a lively talk by UW-Madison Professor, Ethelene Whitmire, author of the 2014 book, <u>Regina Anderson Andrews:</u> <u>Harlem Renaissance Librarian</u>; and **Jazz in Exile**, a documentary on the exodus of many African American jazz musicians to Europe, the reasons for this movement and how it affected both the musicians and the music itself -- discussion following with the film's director, Chuck France. **Project Director: Chris Wagner**
